Please help us customize your tour of the courthouse by marking the agencies you would like to visit. Court schedules and staff availability may limit the choices available.

- U.S. Marshals Service
  - Visitors can tour the office area, squad room, control room and possibly meet with the U.S. Marshal for the District of New Jersey. If no prisoners are present, visitors may able to tour the cellblock area, processing room, and the fitness room.
- U.S. Probation and Pretrial Services Office
  - The United States Probation and Pretrial Services Office performs two functions. First, it completes a presentence investigation on each offender prior to sentencing. Second, it supervises offenders who have been convicted of federal offenses.
  - You may have the opportunity to meet with a United States Probation or Pretrial Services Officer, who will explain what the officers do.
- U.S. District Court, Judges, Clerk's Office, Court Reporters, Interpreters
  - The United States District Court is the federal court of general jurisdiction for the District of New Jersey. The clerk's office provides administrative, technical, and case management support for the court. The clerk's office serves the judges, the public, attorneys, and other federal agencies.
  - Visitors to the courthouse may meet with a law clerk, tour the district and magistrate judge courtrooms and learn about the "high-tech" evidence presentation equipment, or visit with a court reporter or interpreter and see the equipment used in court.
- D Bankruptcy Court

**Please note: The following items are not allowed in the courthouse:** weapons, cameras and other image/video devices, tape recorders, laptops, PDAs, and cellular phones with camera or tape-recorder functionality.

You will need photo identification to enter the courthouse. All visitors and their belongings must go through security (magnetometer and x-ray machine). We recommend visitors do not bring in backpacks, purses, or large coats unless necessary, as this will slow down the security process and entry into the courthouse.
