REQUIREMENTS:

This is a request for quotation (RFQ) for materials and services in connection with the U.S. District Court, District of New Jersey's cyclical carpet replacement for chambers 2060 in the Mitchell H. Cohen Building and U.S. Courthouse – 4th & Cooper Streets, Camden, NJ 08101.

This request is for open market labor pricing. Carpet can be ordered under **Federal Supply Schedule contract # GS-03F-014AA**

All contractors must agree to the terms and conditions set out below:

- A fixed price award from this RFQ will be made based on the lowest price, technically acceptable offer.
- Field measurements are required prior to submitting proposals. Please contact Danielle Hanna (danielle_hanna@njd.uscourts.gov) or Trish Hruschka (trish_hruschka@njd.uscourts.gov) to schedule a site visit. Changes cannot be made after the contract is awarded.
- The contractor must be willing to start work based on a Purchase Order. No down payments or advances will be allowed.
- All work requires escorted access to judiciary facilities. In accordance with Clause 3-3, contractor employees are subject to security checks including background investigations. If the contractor is unable to supply a sufficient number of acceptable employees to work on this project, the judiciary may terminate the contract by default.
- Contractor must submit the names, dates of birth, and social security numbers of all onsite workers at least one week prior to the start of work.
- All quotes shall include estimated times for completion and number of workers needed to accomplish the work.
- Proposal must include the total cost to complete the scope of work in accordance with this RFQ. No additional charges will be accepted.
- Contractors will be responsible for any damage to the building, furnishing, or carpet while work is being performed.

- Award of the contract and acceptance of work will be dependent on approval from the General Services Administration and the Court. **Please note, GSA requires a Certificate of Liability Insurance naming GSA as the beneficiary and material safety data sheets for all contract deliverables.**

SCOPE OF WORK:

The contractor shall provide all labor, materials, supervision, tools, equipment, transportation and incidentals necessary for completion of the project. No equipment, materials, or services of any kind shall be provided by the court.

Contractor Responsibilities:

- **Removal and Installation:** The contractor will remove the existing luxury vinyl tile, carpet, padding and cove base as necessary. The floor will be cleaned and prepared for the new carpet. The contractor will install the new carpet and padding following the manufacturers' recommendations, ensuring patterns are aligned and seams are tight.
- **Ordering and Storage:** The contractor will order, receive, and store the new carpet until installation.

Flooring Selections:

- **Carpet:** Bentley Mills Broadloom Carpet: Kings Road (*Pending final color selection*)
- **Carpet Cushion:** Please include pricing for Bentley Prestige Plus RS.
- **Luxury Vinyl Tile (LVT):** Bentley Mills: Ground Rules (*Pending final color selection*)
- **Cove Base:** pending final selection

Additional Requirements:

- Any chemicals used during the installation must be low odor and non-toxic. If requested, the contractor must provide the material safety data for all chemicals used.
- The contractor will work at the court's convenience, scheduling work during business hours, Monday – Friday, 8AM-4PM.
- The contractor will remove all debris and leftover carpet, disposing of waste off-site. A thorough vacuuming of the area must be performed post-installation to prepare for furniture replacement.
- All additional work necessary to complete painting to meet industry and manufacturers standards and to the satisfaction and approval of the General Services Administration and the Court; and any additional work necessary to meet all local building, fire and safety codes, and the Terms and Conditions set out below.
