IN RE: COVID-19 TEMPERATURE :  
SCREENING PILOT AT THE TRENTON : **STANDING ORDER 2020-15**  
COURTHOUSE :

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Standing Order 2020-14 the United States District Court for the District of New Jersey (“Court”) has established certain protocols for those persons entering the Courthouses of the District of New Jersey; and

**WHEREAS**, the Court desires to establish a pilot project to determine the feasibility and efficacy of a temperature screening process for entrants to its Courthouses; and

**WHEREAS**, consistent with relevant CDC guidelines and public health directives, the Court has developed Pilot Temperature Screening Protocols, including the use of contactless thermometers, for use at the entrances to the Clarkson S. Fisher Building & U.S. Courthouse; and

**WHEREAS**, the Court, through its Court Security Committee, will monitor and evaluate the results of this pilot project, and make recommendations concerning the implementation of Temperature Screening Protocols throughout the District; and

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in order to further public health and safety,


**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that in addition to the requirements of Standing Orders 2020-13 and 2020-14, every person who desires entrance to the Clarkson S. Fisher Building & U.S. Courthouse in Trenton, NJ must have his/her temperature taken, using a contactless thermometer; and

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that any person with a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher, or who refuses to wear a mask or face covering that covers the person’s nose and mouth, or who attempts to enter the Courthouse in violation of this Standing Order will be denied entry to the Courthouse by the U.S. Marshals Service; and

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the U.S. Marshal, his Deputies, and the Court Security Officers shall enforce this Order; and

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that this Order will remain in place until further Order of the Court.
